**Dana C. Tupa,** Professor of JU Art in Ceramics and Division of Visual Arts Chair, was a keynote speaker at the *2018 QuiltFest* pre-view event held at the Prime Osborne Convention Center, September 19-21. Her talk entitled, *The Nine-Patch Struggle: A Journey of the Ceramic Art Quilt*, took the group of professional textilers through the evolution and adaptation of the art quilt into the sculpture realm.

Dr. Scott Watkins, Professor of Music, was at The Eastman School of Music in Rochester, NY, in early August completing research for his forthcoming book on American composer Howard Hanson. His research included exclusive access to letters spanning 1912 to 1925, which Hanson wrote to his parents from California, Chicago, and Italy. The letters were in a condition, which made examining them challenging, but due to Watkins' earlier and extensive work on Hanson, he was granted the opportunity to view and photograph them.
